FIVE ESSENTIAL TIPS FOR MANAGING A PRIVATE PRACTICE

Here, Mr Acworth offers five key tips to help keep a private healthcare practice running smoothly:

- Avoid an inspection by the Inland Revenue. Tax should be paid on invoices issued, not invoices paid – failure to do this could land you a heavy fine. Keep receipts for everything – even stamps.
- You must draw up legally binding contracts for all employers including your spouse or partner.
- Make sure you comply with Data Protection legislation. You need to be registered with the Information Commissioner and patients are entitled to copies under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.
- Remember, if you pay your NHS secretary for private work, <u>you</u> are responsible for ensuring the correct accounting for tax and National Insurance.
- Don't lose your valuable data. Always back-up and save a copy in case of loss, damage or theft of your computer.

Mr Acworth explains; "Take a look around any high street bookshop and you will see a vast library of books on how to start and run a small business. However they are fairly generic and one often finds that the usual rules do not apply in the case of establishing a private practice.
